Farmington, Dec. 16—Mrs. Annette Gardner, wife of the late Rev. Sunderlin P. Gardner, passed away at her home in this town Saturday morning, aged 82 years. She was born in Meadville, Pa., August 24, 1836, and was the daughter of William and Sarah Lord Bell. She attended the Macedon Academy for two years and in 1863 was married to Rev. Sunderlin P. Gardner of Farmington. She leaves three sons, Anson L. Gardner, of Canandaigua; Sunderlin P. Gardner and Oscar B. Gardner, of this town, and six grandchildren. The funeral was held Tuesday afternoon at one o'clock from her late home and at two o'clock from the Hicksite meeting house in Farmington and interment was made in North Farmington cemetery. Rev. Isaac Wilson of Biglarville, Pa., conducted the service.
